NARRATIVE

Archway Classical Academy Cicero (Archway Cicero) and Cicero Preparatory Academy (Cicero Prep) each received charter contracts in September 2013 – Archway Cicero to serve grades K-5 and Cicero Prep to serve grades 6-12 – and both schools opened simultaneously in August 2014. Both schools are part of the Great Hearts Academies network of charter schools and are co-located on the same campus. Archway Cicero is now submitting this Adding Grade Levels to Charter Amendment request to add grade 6 and serve grade levels K-6 effective in 2017-2018. This request is part of a planned reconfiguration of the Great Hearts model to move grade 6 from the prep schools to the Archway schools, beginning with selected schools in 2017-2018. If approval is granted to add grade 6 to Archway Cicero, we will submit a Site Specific Change in Grades Served notification to remove grade 6 from Cicero Preparatory Academy. We are not submitting these requests simultaneously at this time, as we want to be sure we will have grade 6 offered on the Cicero campus in 2017-2108 – in Archway Cicero if this request is approved or in Cicero Preparatory Academy if this request is not approved.

Rationale for the Increase in Grade Levels Served

The reason for adding grade 6 to the current K-5 model is to allow for the full culmination of our Great Hearts Archway curricula, particularly in mathematics, writing and grammar, thereby increasing the readiness of our elementary students for the prep school experience they will encounter when they enter grade 7. Bringing the 6th grade into Archway Classical Academy Cicero will ensure students see the lower school curricula through to their intended ends and enter 7th grade better prepared academically for success in the robust curricula of our middle and upper grades. Additionally, the social and developmental needs of 11 year-olds can be better addressed in a K-6 grade level environment than in a grade level environment that includes middle and high school age students.

How the Addition of Grade 6 Supports the Mission, Educational Philosophy, and Methods of Instruction

The mission of Archway Cicero as stated in its charter application is the same as the mission of Cicero Preparatory Academy and all Great Hearts academies: To enable students to acquire critical reasoning and communication skills and to explore the cultural and scientific achievements that are at the heart of the liberal arts. The school will prepare its graduates for success in succeeding grades and college, and to be leaders in creating a more philosophical, humane, and just society.

Likewise, all Great Hearts academies share the same educational philosophy and methods of instruction. With respect to educational philosophy, they believe the world is ordered and knowable, that the human intellect can attain knowledge of reality through reason, hard work, and a coherent program of study, and that education should proceed via shared inquiry and honest discussion; thoughtful depth about a subject is preferable to broad or rapid coverage. They believe the greatest number of students benefit when the intellectual and moral bar is set high in the classroom, that habits of personal order cultivate habits of intellectual order, and that while students do learn at different paces,

true education is a matter of development over time and within a stable learning community. The essential features of all Great Hearts schools are a core liberal arts curriculum that exceeds state standards in duration and content that all students take: an academy ethos that values character and leadership and exhorts students to create a community of scholarship, leadership, and service in their classrooms, in activities. and in their relationships with peers and teachers; small class size which provides the individual attention that students need to do their best; and a professionally diverse and uniquely trained faculty that is fundamentally Socratic in their approach to students and embraces fully the school's vision of community, learning, leadership, and service. With respect to methods of instruction, all Great Hearts academies use as their main instructional methodology a core curriculum model, which is founded on the belief that to help students attain academic excellence, the curriculum must be solid, sequenced, specific, and shared. The curriculum is standard across the network and is taught using the Socratic Method, which develops thinking, speaking, and reading skills, and increases student involvement. With the Socratic Method, students are actively involved in discovering truths, rather than being informed through lectures in class or readings in textbooks. The teachers' responsibility is to create the right questions for discussion and students find the answers with their reading and reflective activities. Given that grade 6 is already taught at Cicero Preparatory Academy on the same campus where Archway Cicero is located and both schools are Great Hearts academies and have the same mission, educational philosophy, and methods of instruction, the addition of grade 6 to Archway Cicero's charter fully supports the school's mission, educational philosophy, and methods of instruction. The grade 6 curriculum and instruction will be the same as it is now, just delivered in a different building on the campus. It is a seamless move in these respects and will benefit the intellectual and social development of the Cicero campus' 6th grade students.

<u>Level of Proficiency Required for Promotion and Demonstration of Mastery of Academic</u> Content

The Great Hearts core curriculum and methods of instruction are set for all students at all grade levels, although appropriate accommodations are made for ESS and ELL students when needed. All academic core content taught and assessed at the schools is considered mastered when the student demonstrates an 85% or above proficiency level. In making the determination of promotion to the next level, teachers at Great Hearts Archway academies, including Archway Cicero, take into account both the academic ability of the student and his/her ability to thrive and access the rich curriculum at the next grade level. Foremost in this decision is the well-being of the student. In determining promotion, Archway Cicero complies with Arizona Revised Statutes 15-701.A.2, which requires that a student not be promoted from the third grade if the student obtains a score on the Reading portion of the state assessment that demonstrates the student's reading level falls far below the third grade level. Other factors which influence promotion decisions include: academic and task independence of the student relative to grade-level peers; performance in Language Arts and Mathematics which supports success in all academic disciplines; performance on standardized tests and recognized assessments (AzMerit, internal assessments); and

reading achievement and the ability of the student to access the rich and rigorous literature and other curricula at the current and succeeding grade levels.

Changes in Staffing Needed to Implement New Grade

Based on staffing patterns at Archway Cicero, we anticipate that 8 teachers will be needed to cover the 4 sections of 6th grade that will be added to the school: One teacher per content area of Mathematics, Science, English, and History; and one teacher per special area of Art, Music, Latin, and PE. An additional ESS teacher may also be needed, due to the increased enrollment, which would then make a total of 9. Given that all teachers are hired through the Great Hearts central hiring portal, which historically receives 8 applications for every opening position each year, we are confident that these positions can be filled successfully with excellent, highly trained staff.

TIMELINE FOR IMPLEMENTATION

The timeline for implementation of the new grade configuration of K-6 is July 1, 2017.
