Instructional Days Amendment Request-Narrative

1. Describe the reason for the change in instructional days, including how it will improve pupil achievement in the target population.

CASA Academy is requesting a permanent change in instructional days from a 200-day calendar to a 180-day calendar for the following reasons:

Academic Reasons:

- a) Teacher Burnout- CASA Academy had six classroom teachers in the 2015-2016 school year. Of the three teachers that CASA asked to return to CASA for the 2016-2017 school year, all three teachers stated that they could not return to CASA due to its two-hundred day calendar. These three teachers indicated significant "burnout" due to the combination of CASA's extended school day and extended school year.
- b) Teacher Recruitment Obstacle- Between January of 2016 and April of 2016, CASA interviewed 35 teaching candidates for positions at CASA for the 2016-2017 school year. Two of these candidates, after a rigorous interview process, were offered teaching positions at CASA Academy for the 2016-2017 school year. When these positions were offered, however, these teacher candidates ultimately turned the positions down because they wanted to work at 180-day calendar schools. Due to the fact that the majority of schools in Arizona have a 180-day calendar, it is difficult for CASA to compete for high quality teachers.
- c) Student Burnout and Family Vacation Challenges- Despite outreach attempts to communicate the importance of a 200-day calendar, in the summer of 2015, many CASA families approached June as a "summer month" despite CASA's extended school year. This is due, in part, to CASA's partnership with Empower College Prep, a 180 day calendar school that CASA shares bus transportation with; many families send their children to both CASA and Empower. In June of 2015, late bedtimes became more frequent for CASA scholars, school attendance was not as regular and family vacations occurred frequently. This significantly affected the amount of learning that could occur on campus during the four weeks of June; scholars were often absent, tired and distracted in class. This had a detrimental effect on learning in the classroom and on school culture.

Financial Reasons:

a) Student Transiency- CASA Academy serves a population of 97% free or reduced priced lunch. Due to that fact that CASA serves a low-income population, over the course of the school year, a portion of CASA families, despite loving the school, are forced to

withdraw because they move away. At a 180 day calendar school, if a student withdraws after the 100th day, the 180 day calendar school is not penalized financially for having less students on the last day of school. As a 200 day calendar school, however, CASA must have the same amount of students on the 100th day of school and the 200th day of school in order to not incur a financial penalty. For example, in the 2015-2016 school year, nine CASA scholars withdrew between January 20th and April 11th due to the fact that they were moving. This means that unless CASA filled those spots, CASA would lose \$30,500 on the 200th day. While it may seem that it would be easy to fill these spots, a) many interested families do not want to switch their child's school so close to the end of the year and b) academically and culturally, it causes challenges for students to enter CASA so late in the year.

b) Unfortunately, despite knowing about CASA's 200 day calendar and committing to enrolling their children at CASA, many parents still decide to take long vacations during the month of June. This affects CASA's attendance, in particular, for those parents who insist on taking 10 (or more) day vacations in the month of June. Although these families do not want to withdraw their children, because they have taken more than ten unexcused absence days off, CASA is forced to withdraw these students due to the fact that they have missed ten (or more) days of school. This, again, causes CASA to incur a financial penalty (see part A above).

Improving Pupil Achievement

- a) When CASA wrote this charter, CASA strongly believed that increased time in the classroom would yield significant academic gains in the classroom; CASA is still fully committed to its extended day program. Unfortunately, while extended learning time is beneficial, CASA cannot compete with the majority of 180-day calendar schools in Phoenix for high quality teachers. Due to its extended school year, CASA has struggled to recruit and retain outstanding teachers. Ultimately, it is more important for CASA to have the best possible teachers in the classroom than for CASA to have four extra weeks of school. For this reason, CASA seeks to decrease its school year, so that it can hire and retain exemplary teachers in future years.
- b) Although the four extra weeks of school were meant to increase student achievement, currently, they are causing significant student burnout. CASA students should be ready to focus and work hard when in they are in school. Unfortunately, due to the fact that June is treated as a summer month by many CASA families, CASA scholars are not able to focus on their school work as effectively in the month of June. Changing the school calendar from 200 to 180 days will enable students an adequate amount of summer rest so that they can be fully focused during the 180 days that they are in school.

2. Describe how the school calendar and daily instructional schedule(s) provided demonstrate compliance with A.R.S. §15-901 regarding annual instructional hours for each grade served.

As demonstrated in Figure A.1, CASA Academy's 180-day school calendar offers CASA scholars 1060 hours of instruction each year. For kindergarten, this is 704 more instructional hours than required by A.R.S. § 15-901, and for first through third grade, this is 348 more hours than required by A.R.S. § 15-901.

Additionally, as demonstrated by Figure A.2, CASA Academy exceeds the instructional minutes recommended by the State of Arizona for both developmental reading and language arts and math. CASA Academy offers 215 more instructional hours per week for developmental reading and language arts and 195 more instructional hours per week in math.
