Budget	The applicant has designated \$49,000 in other secured funds for start-up purposes that		
	includes a cost-sharing approach for personnel salaries and benefits. Educational		
	Enterprises, Inc. and the original EAGLE College Prep Elementary School will provide		
	curriculum, financial, and management expertise at no cost. A charter school planning		
	grant, to support start-up costs, is also being written. Years one through three of the		
	operating budget are based on 95% of the projected student enrollment. Projected annual		
	budget balances are: Year One - \$187, Year Two - \$139,283, and Year Three - \$134,475.		
	At the end of each month during the first year revenue exceeds expenditures.		
Secured Funds	Educational Enterprises, Inc. is funding the start-up operations as stated in the narrative.		
	No additional secured funds were verified.
