On September 25, 2013, at approximately 5:00 PM, myself (John Penczar) and other staff member were getting ready to leave for the day. We heard an explosion and the power went out. We went out front and all of the neighbors were coming outside because their power was also out. We looked down the street and a telephone pole was broken in half with wires dangling all over the street. Within 15 minutes Tucson Electric Power trucks and police were arriving on scene. Our street (Winstel) and other cross streets were closed with TEP and the police acknowledging a major safety issue. I talked to a supervisor from TEP and he related that our power might be possibly restored early in the morning.

Some staff members arrived early on the 26th and found the power to still be out and the streets still blocked off. TEP personnel had trucks, live wires and other kinds of potentially dangerous equipment up and down the street. Staff reported this to me by phone and I felt it was in the best interest of the students to not have school that day.

An emergency board meeting was held and staff informed parents as they were dropping off children that school was cancelled. Power was not restored until around 1:00 PM that afternoon.
