*KDLO'S RESPONSE* TO MOTION TO ACCEPT, REJECT, OR MODIFY THE ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE'S DECISION AND RECOMMENDED ORDER

Kin Dah Lichi'i Olta' ("KDLO"), by and through its undersigned counsel, hereby submits its Response to the Motion to Accept, Reject or Modify the Administrative Law Judge's Decision and Recommended Order ("KDLO's Response").

Specifically, KDLO objects to the following modifications of the Administrative Law Judge's ("ALJ") Decision as proposed under the Arizona State Board for Charter Schools' ("Arizona State Board") Motion to Accept, Reject or Modify the Administrative Law Judge's Decision and Recommended Order ("Arizona State Board's Motion"):

1. KDLO objects to the entirety of the modifications of the ALJ's Conclusions of Law No. 8 as proposed in the Arizona State Board's Motion. [Arizona State Board's Motion, Conclusions of Law, ¶ 2 at pg. 4.].

2. KDLO objects to the entirety of the modifications of the ALJ's Recommended Order as proposed in the Arizona State Board's Motion. [Arizona State Board's Motion, Order, pg. 7.]

KDLO objects to the proposed modifications cited above because they are contrary to the findings and conclusions made by the ALJ. The parties have had an opportunity to fully present evidence and testimony in this matter. The ALJ is in the best position regarding this matter to issue a fair and appropriate Order that should not be ignored or circumvented by legal maneuvering. Furthermore, the ALJ's Recommended Order is supported by his finding under Conclusion of Law No. 8.

KDLO requests that the Recommended Order of the ALJ be adopted in its entirety as issued by the ALJ in his April 22, 2014 Administrative Law Judge Decision with the following single modification:

Based on the foregoing, it is recommended it is ordered that the revocation of the charter issued to Charter Holder to operate the School be revoked on the effective date of the Order entered in this matter placed under a moratorium of High Density Native American Charter Schools until such time as it is determined that the Charter Holder has established that it is performing academically based on the standards and conditions established under the moratorium.

KDLO's proposed modification is based on the disparate impact of current Arizona Department of Education ("ADE") standards which have resulted in de facto prohibition of Arizona Native American Charter schools from participating in the Arizona State Charter school system. This disparate impact has prompted Senator Carlyle Begay of the Arizona State Legislature to organize on behalf of Arizona's High Density Native American Charter schools, of which KDLO is one, by calling for a moratorium to halt the revocation of any additional

charters from High Density Native American Charter schools until this issue can be addressed and corrective measures put in place to preserve these schools for the Native American children they serve. It would be manifestly unjust to preclude KDLO from the benefit of this moratorium because it has been victimized by the inapplicable standards which Senator Begay seeks to correct.

This proposed modification for the High Density Native American Charter school moratorium to apply to KDLO, is in keeping with the ALJ's Recommended Order to reject the revocation of KDLO's charter if KDLO receives a grade of A, B, or C for the 2013-2014 school year by recognizing that KDLO has made academic progress and that preservation of its charter is vital to the lives of the children it serves.
