# **Business Plan/Budget**

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Budget	Funds contributed by founding principles for startup revenue for PLC Arts Academy at Glendale is \$15,000. They plan to perform most of the start-up activities in coordination with its sister chart schools Arts Academy at South Mountain and Arts Academy at Estrella Mountain. The pre-opening activities will make the new school an effectively functioning education unit. The Articles of Incorporation has received a DUNS number, federal EIN and will be applying for federal 501(c) (3) tax-exempt status. Years one through three of the operating budget is based on 90% of the projected student enrollment. Projected annual budget balances are: Year One-\$4,216, Year Two-\$13,125, Year three-\$29,181. At the end of each month during the first year revenue exceeds expenditures.
