Description of Community and Target Market	Arts Academy at Scottsdale will target all students K through 4 grades in the Scottsdale, Phoenix, Gilbert, Tempe area, as well as from other communities including the Navajo Nation and Pima Indian Reservation. Arts Academy at Scottsdale will be drawing from students from several school districts located in the 10 mile radius area of its planned location (7214 E. Jenan Dr. Scottsdale, AZ 85260). Scottsdale Unified, Paradise Valley Unified and Fountain Hills Unified. Over 63,000 students reside on the territory of these three districts.

Comprehensive Program of Instruction Summary	In the narrative, the applicant proposes to provide a standards-based curriculum which focuses on math, reading, writing, grammar, social studies and science. These subjects are then integrated with other subject matter and the performing arts to enhance the learning process and to engage and reach all learners. Arts Academy at Scottsdale will use various teaching strategies. Teachers will use lecture, field trips, experiments, demonstrations, inquiry-based projects, reading, writing, videos, research, technology, hands-on assignments and cooperative learning. Arts Academy at Scottsdale will provide teaching methods and learning environment in the classroom conducive to all learners in that students will be engaged in all activities. Arts Academy at Scottsdale will offer an integrated and comprehensive performance and visual arts education, aligned to the Arizona State Articulated Standards, as well as the National Standards for Arts Education. Benchmark testing will be done at the beginning of the school year as a pre-test. If will be done as a mid-test in December and again in May as a post-test. Pre- Test/Post-Test assessments will be used with a quarterly comprehensive reading and math assessments. Formative assessments will be administered at the completion of a unit of study in order to assess the academic progress of students. Standardized testing will include AIMS DPA and TerraNova. #### **Business Plan/Budget**

Budget	Funds contributed by founding principles for startup revenue for PLC Arts Academy at Scottsdale is \$15,000. P.L.C. Charter Schools currently operates Arts Academy at
	Scottsdale serving grades K-4 at the same location of the proposed school in this application. They plan to perform most of the start-up activities in coordination with its sister chart schools Arts Academy at South Mountain and Arts Academy at Estrella Mountain. The pre-opening activities will make the new school an effectively functioning education unit. The Articles of Incorporation has received a DUNS number, federal EIN
	and will be applying for federal 501(c) (3) tax-exempt status. Years one through three of the operating budget is based on 90% of the projected student enrollment. Projected annual budget balances are: Year One-\$28,633, Year Two-\$32,188, Year three-\$34,143. At the end of each month during the first year revenue exceeds expenditures.
