General Matter

Meeting called to order at 9:00 a.m.

Pledge of Allegiance.

<u>Public Comment</u> – There was no public comment.

Chair's Report – No report.

<u>Associate Superintendent's Report</u> – Mr. Miller welcomed the Board and gave an updated report on the schools current enrollment numbers and announced that they are currently at its highest number of students enrolled at Arizona Collegiate High School; current number of students enrolled is at 194. He discussed the schools have already submitted their recruitment plans for the next school year which have been reviewed by Mr. Miller and Mr. Kressler and have started the recruitment process for the 2014/2015 school year. Mr. Miller spoke on the negotiation of the media contracts with Riviera Radio Station which is set to begin the first broadcasts in May of 2014. Mr. Miller discussed the schools current teaching vacancies at the school which is Science, and the Assistant Principals position is currently open for the next year, interviews will be beginning the following week. Mr. Miller also commented about the PARCC testing that took place at the schools which will most likely be the testing that the state of Arizona will use.

Principal's Report - Mr. Dunbar spoke on the PARCC testing that took place at the school and noted that Arizona Collegiate High School was one of the 10% of schools that were chosen to participate in the field survey and were also awarded to take the test on paper which made the testing run much smoother. Mr. Dunbar also commented that the sophomore students were chosen to take the English assessment and also commented that the school had a great testing

turnout and complimented all the English department and the testing coordinator Debbie Jensen on the great job that was done with the students, they are currently awaiting to see what assessment will be chosen for next school year. He discussed that the scores for the reading and writing AIMS tests were in and that the scores were fantastic and staff are now working with the students to communicate their scores and to finalize graduation arrangements. Mr. Dunbar noted that the school had massive gains in both reading and writing from previous years and are anxiously awaiting the math AIMS scores that are due to come in May 16th. Mr. Dunbar spoke on the computer incentive give-away at Arizona Collegiate High School where about 20 students were chosen to receive the new touch screen netbooks. Arizona Collegiate High School is still currently working with WestEd which is an academic consulting group which works with the principal and teachers on classroom observations which has been a great tool that has been available for the staff. Mr. Dunbar spoke on graduation and noted that Arizona Collegiate High School has more graduates then they have had in the past, in December the school had graduated 19 students and are looking to add another 40 to graduate in May. Mr. Dunbar discussed that Arizona Collegiate High School is currently in the process of submitting for a 21st Century Grant which will allow the school for new opportunities for the students and families. Surveys were handed out to families which indicated they were interested in computer training to be able to support their students get to college which is the schools push right now as well as help them find a job. The grant will also provide the school with visual arts programs, dance programs and tutoring, they are awaiting the approval which should be some time in the summer.
