Narrative for Program of Instruction Amendment Request Westwind Preparatory Academy

Westwind Preparatory Academy has served students as a charter school since 1998. During that time, we have worked diligently to ensure that our students have the opportunity for a high quality education. We have used such benchmarks as performances on state mandated tests, as well as other standardized assessments and internal assessments. The data is not only collected but disaggregated and analyzed. Then curriculum and instruction is modified in areas where the data indicates changes should occur. The rationale for this Program of Instruction Amendment Request is to add a program of instruction to our existing materials that will increase the rigor for our students, thus improving their academic performance and better preparing them for higher education.

The Arizona State Board for Charter Schools' Level of Adequate Academic Progress (LAAP) indicates that schools serving grades 10 -12, which WPA does, must meet or exceed the average percent proficient in reading and math on the state assessment. While Westwind Prep has consistently done this, we recognize that it is in the best interest of our students to offer a rigorous and relevant curriculum that will go beyond an adequate, average level. As a result, the school's board looked for additional program of instruction materials that would help students meet and exceed proficiency in reading, math and writing. They voted to implement the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Programme.

The IB Diploma Programme is a demanding two-year curriculum leading to final examinations and a qualification that is welcomed by leading universities around the world. The IB programme is a comprehensive curriculum with extensive support materials and training for teachers. There is a strong emphasis on reading, writing, math and science. For example, the integrated math courses, while encompassing the materials covered in the state's standards, goes well beyond. Furthermore, students are required to write an extended essay, which is graded by external evaluators prior to students receiving their IB Diploma. However, IB also requires students to complete service work outside of the classroom. Westwind will not only offer the program once it becomes a full IB World School (it is now a candidate school), we will offer preparatory classes for freshmen and sophomores so they will be adequately prepared as juniors and seniors for the IB programme. IB Programme students study six courses at higher level or standard level. Students have a breadth of experience in languages, social studies, the experimental sciences and mathematics. Students also study in a sixth area that could be the arts or expanded study of areas one through five. The IB curriculum aligns with and goes beyond the Arizona Academic Standards. Teachers will continue to document their instructional alignment with standards while implementing the IB curriculum.
